Alcohol Awareness Month

April is Alcohol Awareness Month, with the goal of increasing public awareness and understanding of the causes and treatment of alcohol use disorders. Alcohol Use Disorder also known as AUD is a medical condition that is characterized by an inability to stop or control alcohol use despite adverse consequences. There are also factors that increase the risk of AUD such as genetics, family history of alcohol use, a history of trauma, and many more.

Despite alcohol being the third leading cause of preventable death in the United States, with approximately 95,000 Americans dying from alcohol-related causes each year, alcohol remains the most commonly consumed substance among both youth and adults. Remember Alcohol Use Disorder can affect anybody, regardless of demographics.

Individuals who consume significant amounts of alcohol increase their risk of injury, violence, liver disease, and some forms of cancer, as well as having major consequences in their relationships and social life.

AUD STATISTIC

In 2022, 753,000 youth aged 12 to 17 experienced AUD in the previous year.

adults ages 18 and older had experienced AUD in the past year.

WHAT INCREASES RISK OF AUD

- Drinking at an early age.
- Genetics.
- Family history of alcohol problems.
- Mental health conditions.
- A history of trauma.
